Attached are a cover letter composed by Julie Anne Robinson, Drama Director, tentative itinerary, field trip request form, and estimated travel information. As articulated in Ms. Robinson's letter, this trip will provide our growing number of drama students exposure to Broadway and the NYC theatre world. Connecting with GBN alumni active in NYC theatre makes the trip even more compelling.

Ms. Robinson and Instructional Supervisor, Chad Davidson, have developed a trip cycle for drama that mirrors the rotation for trips in band, choir, and orchestra. In years that choir travels, drama will not and vice versa due to the large number of students involved in both activities.

Please accept my enthusiastic support of this initiative.

Rationale for Theatre Tour 2009 New York City

It is my hope to offer a unique and educational opporutnity to the students in the Glenbrook North Theatre Program by traveling to the center of the theatre world: New York City. This will be a three-day two-night trip scheduled for October 23-25, 2009. Students would need to be excused from classes on Friday, October 23. We are currently aiming to take approximatly 40-50 students, three GBN faculty members, and a number of parent chaperones on this trip. Only next year's sophomores, juniors, and seniors will be considered for this trip, and we will use the thespian point system, based off the number of hours a student has participated in GBN Drama, as criteria for selection. Our plan is to use Educational Tours, Inc., whom the GBN Choral Music Program has used for over thirty-years. Our tour representive and GBN theatre parent, Kristina Orticelli, is currently developing a detailed itinerary and cost breakdown for your perusal. Upon adminstrative approval, the rest of the details will be finalized.

I believe that this trip is educational for a variety of reasons. Many Glenbrook alumni, including **Noah Weisberg, Chris Hoch, and Alice Lee**, are currently working on Broadway and our students will get a chance to meet with them, tour theatre facilities, and have special opportunities that wouldn't otherwise present themselves. In addition, students will see three or more professional theatre productions. Finally, this tour is not limited to theatre education; students will also have cross-curricular educational experiences by visiting historical landmarks such as the Statue of Liberty, Rockefeller Center, and Ground Zero.

I hope that this tour will set a tradition so future generations of students can experience a meaningful excursion that they might not have the opportunity to take.
