Communications Update

The administration:

- Reminded the Board that there will be more to come on this topic with an update in September
- Provided background about using research to plan, implement, and evaluate communication
- Shared an example of how School Messenger is used to communicate with families and for emergency notifications
- Noted that a survey will be launched to receive feedback from all families about how they get their communication
 - We will reach out to more families than we did in the audit
 - Provided some examples of survey questions
 - Noted the survey will be translated into four common languages
 - Will consider barriers to communication for families
 - Explained how the survey will be shared with families
- Shared questions posed to staff regarding communications and referenced upcoming meetings with staff to generate a staff survey
 - Will identify gaps and issues in communication across the district
- Shared systems and processes currently under review by the communications department
 - Noted that SchoolMessenger has text capability but we are not currently using that feature
 - Outlined challenges and opportunities with current systems including the need for additional staff training
 - o Provided examples of data that will be gathered and analyzed
- Explained the communication review process which includes research, planning, implementation, and evaluation
- Reviewed the timeline for some of the communications work and shared examples
 of things that are being planned
- Shared data regarding social media interactions
- Commented on ways the communications team has supported the district this summer

A board member commented that those who cannot pay dues to the parent association should be given access to the organization. The administration noted that these organizations are outside of the purview of the school district, but they do work with families who wish to join and cannot afford to pay.

In response to Board members' questions, the administration:

- Spoke of a process to avoid inundating families with too many messages so that important information isn't ignored
- Noted the importance of opportunities for two-way communication with the district and will work to enhance two-way communication
- Will look into a way to stay ahead of the news cycle in terms of district responses
- Explained that a communications calendar is in the planning stages
- Explained how cancelations of athletic events are communicated

Board members:

 Commented about the importance of getting feedback from staff and tools to use to help support the staff • Suggested ways to help inform the Board about issues families are struggling with in order to be proactive

A school calendar study was suggested as a new topic. Dr. Johns stated that this topic may emerge through strategic planning as we obtain wider stakeholder feedback. As we engage in strategic planning this year we will identify areas of future focus.
