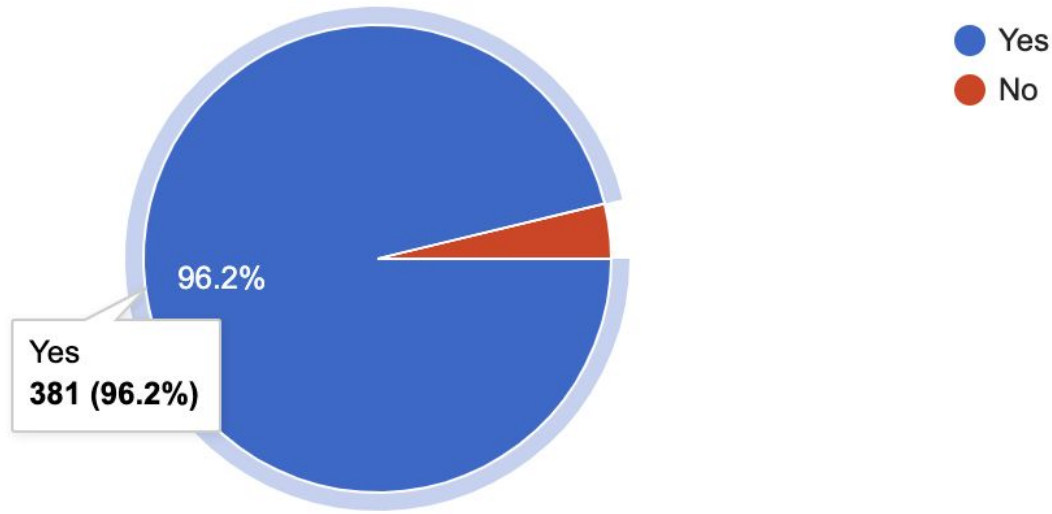
Vaccine Update

- Several school districts surrounding Glenbrook have announced and/or started a vaccination program for their staff. These districts are either supported by a community-based own public health department (e.g., Evanston, Skokie), or are in an adjacent county.
- Glenbrook's vaccination efforts remain dependent upon Cook County's ability to respond to our offers to host testing locations, and its own internal planning and available resources.
- As of Monday, January 25, personnel employed by schools are eligible to receive the vaccine. Some staff have utilized their group 1b status to sign-up for a vaccination through one of the established testing sites (e.g., Jewel Osco, Cook County designated vaccination sites).

Student Learning Plan Update

Creation of a “Wait List” for In-Person Learning

- Parents were asked to commit to either in-person learning or remote learning prior to January 14th for the time frame of Tuesday, January 19 - Friday, March 19.
 - In mid-March, students will have another opportunity to choose their preferred learning plan for the remainder of the school year, Monday, March 29 - Thursday, June 3.
- Based on the response rate, and an analysis of room capacity, the school district was able to accommodate full day in-person learning for those that expressed interest.
- Since the announcement, additional families have expressed interest in switching from remote to in-person learning.
- Each school has established a “wait list” for students that would like to switch learning plans.
- The Student Services and Technology Services teams have created a process that enables a scenario to be processed to determine if there is sufficient space in classrooms to accommodate additional in-person learners.
