

# Procedures for Implementing Board Policy: Professional Leave

### Section A - Leave Form

All certified staff requesting professional leave shall complete a Request for Professional Leave form prior to the date of the requested leave. Within threefive working days of returning from the leave, the employee shall complete a Statement of Actual Expenses Paid by Employee and submit any appropriate expenses incurred along with itemized proof of payment to their supervisor for review and approvalit to the principal's office, accompanied by supporting receipts. In the case of district office employees, the form and receipts shall be submitted to the office of the assistant superintendent for business affairs. Prior approval by the Board of Education shall also be required for any professional leave event either where more than six members are attending or where the total estimated cost exceeds \$5,000. When more than six staff members district wide request authorization for professional leave to attend the same conference when the leave involves out-of-state travel or requires overnight accommodations, authorization shall require prior approval of the Board of Education.

## <u>Section B - Scope Travel Reimbursement Procedures</u>

### Scope

Employees traveling on official Glenbrook business must comply with all applicable Board travel policies and procedures.

### Section C - Travel Expenditures

### 1. Cash Advances

- a. Cash a**Advances** will not be issued for the purposes of staff travel unless there are no practicable alternatives.
- b. In the event that a cash advance is issued, a request for the advance must be submitted to the business services department at least 10 days prior to the date that such advance is required.
- c. Staff members receiving cash advances will be required to submit detailed receipts supporting the total amount of the cash advance within three working days of returning from the event to their supervisor. Any remaining balance owed to the school district must be remitted to the business services department within five working days of returning from the leave. The requested on a Request for Professional Leave Form (RPLF). Travel advances are limited to 2/3 of the total actual estimated out-of-pocket expenses. Advances shall be issued no sooner than five (5) days prior to the date of travel. Advances will only be issued when an overnight stay is required and the amount of the advance is at least \$50.11

## 2. Prepaid Expenses

- a. Prepaid expenses for airfare, accommodations, and conference registration must be requested on a Request for Professional Leave Form.
- b. Whenever possible, prepaid expenses should be paid for in the form of a district-issued disbursement (e.g., check, electronic payment), or by use of a district procurement card. Prepaid expenses are not eligible for advance.



- 3. Expense Reportingg Connected to Glenbrook Business Travel
  - a. A check request for expense reimbursement The official Statement of Actual Expenses

    Paid shall be submitted by a staff member used to requestport expense reimbursements.
  - b. Itemized receipts are required for all reimbursements. Receipts are required for transportation, lodging or miscellaneous expenses that individually exceed \$10.00.
- 4. The following expenses are reimbursable:
  - a. Travel
    - Mileage, parking and tolls where appropriate. In the event that an individual
      chooses to use a personal vehicle, reimbursement will not exceed the cost of a
      round trip coach airfare and will be paid at the current IRS mileage in effect each
      year.
    - ii. Commercial air travel. Travel arrangements should be booked as soon as possible to take advantage of any advance purchase discounts.
    - iii. Ground transportation as needed. Travelers should seek the most economical means of ground transportation. Generally, airport or hotel shuttles provide the least expensive means of reaching a destination and should be used when available. In cases where it is determined that another alternative is more cost efficient the traveler may elect to use the alternative.
    - iv. Telephone calls to the home or school district not seen as excessive in non-emergency situations. Lodging
    - v. Lodging expenses should not exceed the single occupancy conference rate for the headquarters hotel.

### b. Meals

- i. The general guidelines for meal reimbursement eligibility are as follows:
  - 1. Breakfast when departing for travel at or before 6:00 AM;
  - 2. Lunch when the event takes place between the hours of 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM; and
  - 3. Dinner when returning from travel, or departing for travel at or after 7:00 PM
- ii. For overnight travel, the supervisor may authorize meal reimbursement. Such reimbursement shall not exceed the current Meal and Incidental Expenses (M&IE) rates published by the U.S. General Services Administration for breakfast, lunch, and dinner (note: Illinois standard rate).
- iii. If meals are provided as part of an event or registration fee, no other meal reimbursements will be provided for those meals.
- c. Reasonable gGratuities not to exceed 15%.Guide: \$.75 \$1.00 per bag, 15% for cabs, and 10 15% for restaurants.
- d. Commercial air travel. All air transportation will be arranged directly with the director of operations. Travel arrangements should be booked as soon as possiblet least 21 days in advance of travel to take advantage of any advance purchase discounts.
- e. Lodging expenses for conferences should not exceed the single occupancy conference rate for the headquarters hotel.
- f. Ground transportation as needed. Travelers should seek the most economical means of ground transportation. Generally, airport or hotel shuttles provide the least expensive means of reaching a destination and should be used when available. In cases where it is



determined that another alternative is more cost efficient the traveler may elect to use the alternative.

- 5. The following items are not reimbursable:
  - a. Personal health and recreational expenses;
  - b. Other personal expenses (not related to Glenbrook business);
  - c. Alcoholic beverages, tobacco, and cannabis products;
  - d. Entertainment expenses include but are not limited to, shows, amusements, theaters, circuses, sporting events, or any other place of public or private entertainment or amusement unless the entertainment is ancillary to the purpose of the program or event; and
  - e. Airline internet access service fees.

### 6. Expense Travel Reconciliation

Staff: It is the responsibility of each supervisor to review business-related business related travel expenses to ensure that they are in compliance with the regulations. It is within the jurisdiction of the supervisor to disallow reimbursement of expenses that are not in compliance with the regulations or are deemed to be unreasonable or excessive. Upon the approval recommendation of the supervisor and the business services department and after the approval of the business office, payment will be made to the claimant.

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Board: All requests for business travel must be approved in advance by the president in accordance with this regulation.

## 7. Cancellations

Unused tickets or any portion thereof must be returned to the travel agency as soon as possible for proper credit and processing. The travel agency should be notified immediately if a ticket is lost or if there are any changes in travel plans.

8. Combining Business And/or Personal Expenses
Individuals, who extend a business trip for personal reasons, are responsible for any increased costs.

#### 9. Meals

- a. Those conference meals which are paid along with the registration fee, will be paid at full cost. No other per diem meal reimbursement will be provided for discretionary travel.¶
- b. For overnight travel, such as travel for IHSA, sanctioned events or district required travel, the superintendent or his designee may authorize meal reimbursement. Such reimbursement shall not exceed the following guidelines:
  - i. Breakfast \$4.00 (Leaving at or before 6:00 a.m.)
  - ii. Lunch \$8.00 (Only if on approved professional development leave or approved field trip)¶
- 10. Dinner \$20.00 (returning from travel at or after 7:00 p.m. or beginning travel prior to 6:30 p.m.)

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
