Required Testing Program Enrollment of Students and Staff



• Staff

- 1,150 Employees (includes Substitutes, Staff on Leave)
 - 921 (80%) Exempt from Testing
 - 229 (20%) Enrolled in Weekly COVID-19 Testing Program

• Students

- 5,147 Students
 - **2,062 (40%) Students Participate in High-Risk Activities**
 - 1,664 (81%) Exempt from Testing
 - 398 (19%) Enrolled in Weekly COVID-19 Testing Program
 - **3**540 (69%) Students Have Submitted Vaccination Records

Testing Program Status Quo (Option 1)



- Employee/Volunteer/Contracted Service Personnel
 - Must submit evidence that they are fully vaccinated <u>or</u>
 - Participate in a weekly COVID-19 testing program using the SHIELD Illinois test.
- Students Participating in Higher-Risk Extra-Curricular Activities
 - Must submit evidence that they are fully vaccinated <u>or</u>
 - Participate in a weekly COVID-19 testing program using the SHIELD Illinois test.
- Symptomatic Employees and Students
 - Offered a SHIELD Illinois test; directed to stay home until negative test result received.
 - Testing available every school day at the District Administration Building until 3:30 PM.
- Non-Symptomatic, Vaccinated Employees and Students
 - Able to voluntarily participate in the COVID-19 testing program.
- Non-symptomatic, Unvaccinated Exposed Students
 - Test to stay protocols
- As directed by the CCDPH in cases of an outbreak
