RE: Approval of Student Fees for the 2011 – 2012 School Year

It is recommended that the Board of Education

Approve the student fees for the 2011 - 2012 school year, as attached. In response to current economic conditions, we are recommending no increase in student fees, as well as maintaining the current 50% sibling rider discount for transportation.

## **Student Transportation**

For the third consecutive year, we are recommending no increase in student transportation fees. Based on the recent transportation bid from First Student, it is recommended that for the 2011/12 school year, we maintain fees at the previous year's level. The objective in keeping fees flat is to maintain existing ridership levels, thereby ensuring the continued viability of the program.

- Registration period will run from April 4<sup>th</sup> June 3<sup>rd</sup>
- After June 3<sup>rd</sup>, seats will be offered on a "space available basis" and based on existing stops and routes
- No new routes will be added after June 3<sup>rd</sup>
- A 50% discount will be available for sibling riders
- As has been common practice, we will offer a \$25 discount for anyone registering via the Internet

In 2008/09 the board approved a revision to Section C, #10 of Board Policy Procedures 8230: Food Service and School Aid for Children of Low Income Families, which allows for a 50% reduction PER FAMILY for the cost of a bus pass for those families that qualify as "reduced" when applying for financial aid.

### **Driver Education Fees**

We are recommending maintaining fees for Driver Education Behind-the-Wheel at \$350, which is the maximum amount allowed under our current waiver.

#### **Parking Sticker Fees**

We are recommending no increase for parking sticker fees. Although the District incurs annual costs to maintain its parking lots, recent bids for paving and resurfacing work have been favorable.

## **Towel and Material Fees**

We are recommending maintaining the towel and material fees at the prior year level of \$25.50.

### **Credit Card Convenience Fee**

We are recommending maintaining the credit card convenience fee for online sales at \$2.50 per transaction.

# **Pre-School Tuition Fee**

We are recommending no increase for pre-school tuition for GBS. Due to declining enrollment at GBN, the program is currently under review for possible restructure. Therefore, the recommendation for pre-school tuition at GBN is deferred to the March 14, 2011 meeting. Both schools may begin accepting \$50 deposits, non-refundable at GBS only.

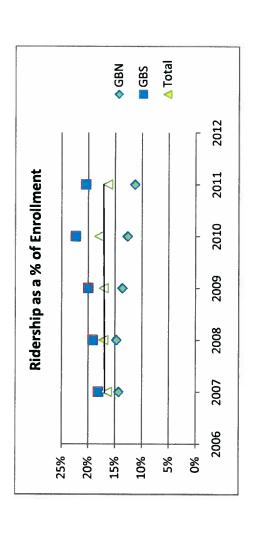

**UPDATE on FREE & REDUCED BREAKFAST PROGRAM** 

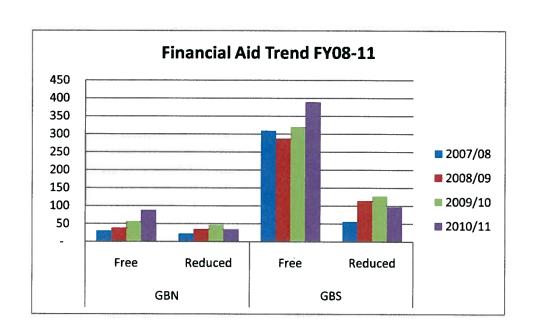
At the September 27, 2010 board meeting, the Board of Education approved offering a free and reduced breakfast program to students meeting federal eligibility requirements. The estimated annual cost of offering such a program was estimated to be \$9,000 - \$30,000 depending on overall participation.

To date, the average number of free/reduced breakfast meals sold per day is 26 at GBS and 5 at GBN. If this trend continues, based on 170 days of school, the annual cost to the district is estimated at \$7,115. A mailing was sent to parents on September 29, 2010 informing them of the program.

The district has been and is required to offer a free/reduced lunch program. To date, the average number of free/reduced lunch meals sold per day is 220 at GBS and 47 at GBN. These figures have increased 65% over last year. Total estimated annual cost is \$106,000. Under our current contract, Quest absorbs this full cost.

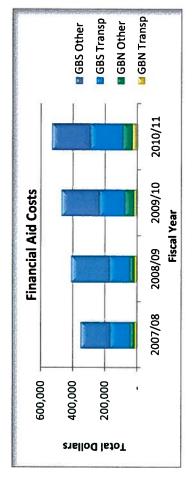
