We will recognize achievement in art and writing. GBS student Inhwan Choi was the first place national winner in the Great Frame Up art competition. As the first place winner, she received a \$2,000 scholarship. Inhwan and her art teacher Stephanie Self will discuss the competition. This is the first time a Glenbrook student has won the top national award in this competition. It was also the first time that The Great Frame Up in Niles, 8305 ½ West Golf Road, Niles, participated in the competition with Glenbrook South High School.

In writing, the Glenbrooks have a bumper crop of national winners in the National Council of Teachers of English. Typically we may have one winner from each school. This year, we have three winners from Glenbrook North and one winner from Glenbrook South. As far as anyone can remember, we have never had this many winners from one school. The GBN students are Michael Eichner, Michelle Spivak and Vinay Sridharan and the GBS student is Ashley Chen. Nationally, 1,783 students were nominated and 544 students were selected.
